They had a vision to create holistic and sensitive individuals, able to take on the world and leave their mark wherever they go. Since its establishment in 1988, the school has been guided by the four core values - Integrity, Pursuit of Excellence, Sensitivity, and Pride in One's Own Heritage, all of which are epitomised by the students

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the school is to provide each student a diverse education in a safe, supportive environment that promotes sound values, self-discipline, motivation and excellence in learning. ACCREDITATION

We are accredited to the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE), Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE) & the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). The medium of instruction for all subjects, except second language, is English, from Nursery to Grade XII. Given the diversity of regional languages in India, we support students in case they want to pursue their mother tongue.

SCHOOL CALENDAR

ICSE/ISC: The school year is divided into **two semesters.** The first semester runs from April to September. The second semester runs from October to March. The typical school day is from 8.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. (Monday to Thursday) and till 3:00 p.m. on Fridays for all students. For IGCSE & IB students, a typical day is from 8.00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on all days. The schedule is organised on a 10-11/12 period basis of 30 minutes each.

However, this academic year, due to online teaching and resultant screen fatigue, timings have been reduced; the new timings are from 8:30 to 1:30.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA & REPORTING

Students are evaluated following the systematic format of Formative and Summative assessments. Student learning is measured on an ongoing basis through regular cycle tests, term examinations and internal assessments. Formal examinations are introduced in Grade VIII.

Grade IX and XI have two examination cycles:

Term I (August- September) and Term II (Final Term) (February – March). The papers for the Final Term examinations of Grade IX and XI are sent by the Council but are corrected and moderated by internal teachers.

Grade X and XII have two (internal) examination cycles: Term I (August- September) and Preboards (December).

The ISC board examination (national-external) begins in February.

Academic reporting is in accordance with the standards outlined by the CISCE (in percentages), Cambridge IGCSE (in grades) and IBO (in points). The same grading system applies for the Predicted scores.

SCHOOL POLICY FOR COLLEGE APPLICATIONS:

Predicted grades: these are not based on any single examination. They are generated on basis of an algorithm as follows:

Grade X Board marks: 25%

Grade XI Term I / Final Term (Final Term Question Paper is sent by the Council) Examination: 20%

Grade XI Final Term/Grade XII Term I Examination: 40%

Teachers' (Subject Teacher) discretion: 15%

This is used as an indicative formula by the subject teacher.

However, the Term I Exams were not conducted due to the pandemic. Instead an online formative assessment was conducted. Hence the weightage was altered as follows:

Grade X Board Exam (40%) Grade XI Final Term Examination (35%) Grade 12 (25%). The Grade 12 weightage is based on student performance through the term. This also includes the qualitative online assessment conducted in September.

For IB students, the predicted grades are out of 45.

Term 1 or Term II marks of Grade XII (along with Grade IX, X and XI final results) are transcribed in the initial transcript. Pre-board marks are transcribed for the mid-year report. ISC board marks are transcribed for the Final transcript.

However, as Term I Exams were not conducted, the Predicted Grades (along with Grade IX, X and XI final results) have been

UNIVERSITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAMS:

Regular sessions of universities/colleges and college fairs are held for students and parents on campus. Special care is taken to invite universities across the world to interact with students to help them a have a wider horizon. Students from grade 9 and onwards are registered on Cialfo- an online career counselling software to support them in their subject selection, course browsing and university applications.

MENTORING BY CAREER COUNSELLING TEAM:

The school has a team of three dedicated career counsellors with one Coordinator. Upon an entry in grade 9 a student is attached to a particular counsellor throughout the school journey till graduation. A system of mentoring students builds a strong rapport between counsellor and student and supports students in their profile building journey for strong college placements. Apart from college placements these mentors are also responsible for supporting students in their subject-course-college selection and help them with college applications as culmination to their relationship.
